Free New Brunswick Medicare for international students

All international students who possess a valid study permit and provide proof of full-time registration as a student at a New Brunswick college or university, and remain enrolled in a full-time course load the entire academic year, will be eligible for free Medicare coverage, as will their spouse and dependents. This will help address additional out-of-pocket expenses for international students in New Brunswick.

The Bridging Program

Students who do not meet the English language requirement will be automatically considered for our Bridging Program. Students with IELTS 6.0 with a minimum band score of 5.5 or TOEFL iBT 80 can join Mount Allison University and begin their academic courses along with English for Academic Purposes classes. The program is designed to be a two-term program.

ATLANTIC IMMIGRATION PROGRAM

It allows graduating students with full-time job offers in an Atlantic province (New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador, Nova Scotia, or Prince Edward Island) to apply for permanent residency (PR) sooner.
